Speakers will include practitioners from across a range of service providers addressing **school culture, the learner's experience and evidencing impact.**

There will be inputs from the Scottish Government's **Looked After Children Policy Team, the Improving Learning Outcomes Activity Hub** (part of the **Looked After Children Strategic Implementation Group**) and **Scotland's New Centre for Excellence for Looked After Children.**
